

RICHARD M. GOTTLIEB, MD

Richard M. Gottlieb, M.D. was the Director of Faculty at the New York Psychoanalytic Institute and Training and Supervising Analyst at the Berkshire Psychoanalytic Institute in New York. He was Associate Editor for Clinical Studies of the Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association and Associate Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine in New York City. During the past 3 years, he has been a consultant and contributor of the upcoming IPA Inter-Regional Encyclopedic Dictionary of Psychoanalysis.

Dr. Gottlieb maintained clinical practice in psychoanalysis, psychotherapy and psychiatry in New York City and Sharon, Connecticut for more than 30 years. He lectured widely, within the United States and abroad and published scholarly articles in all of the major psychiatric and psychoanalytic journals. His work has been recognized by the New York Psychoanalytic Institute's Heinz Hartmann Award, the American Psychoanalytic Association's Edith Sabshin Teaching Award, and the Journal Prize of the Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association.

Richard was deeply engaged in the ongoing evolution of psychoanalysis as a field, and in many facets of life 'beyond the couch'. Together with his life partner Josephine Wright, MD, also a psychiatrist and psychoanalyst, he frequently engaged in bringing psychoanalysis to the 'public square', co-authoring publications about overuse of medication for children with behavioral problems and contributing commentaries in national newspapers.

Missed sorely by us all, Richard Gottlieb is leaving a legacy of a psychoanalyst who is deeply engaged in the world and in life's many dimensions.
